Students with allergies

We are NOT a nut free school, however we stress that students do not share their food and wash their hands after eating.

Excursions

As explained on Tuesday evening at the I Learn/We Learn session, excursions have been planned for all class groups:



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St Joseph's Parish School expectations about "homework"

At St Joseph's we prefer the term 'home tasks' as homework is traditionally associated with students 'doing' worksheets for the sake of doing homework. Instead, we promote that home tasks are about practising skills students have mastered, having positive conversations at home about school and developing a good work ethic and time management.

Non-negotiable home tasks

- Read as often as possible. To encourage and reward students, we have the home reading diary to complete when students have read. We present awards for every 25 nights of reading; 25, 50, 75, 100 etc. In addition students receive a book of their choice from our collection, for milestone tallies at 100, 200 and 300 nights.
- Talk about what your child has been learning at school. Positive talk and specific questions are helpful, eg. What was your favourite activity today? What were you learning in mathematics/ art/ history? What did you enjoy today or find challenging?

Optional home tasks

- Online learning; Mathletics, Reading Eggs, Typing Tournament, Soundwaves or Prodigy.
- Home Enrichment tasks - specific tasks or competitions set by the school. (Term 1 task soon.)

Recommended time to spend on set home tasks each night;

K- Year 2 up to 10 to 15 minutes

Year 3/4 up to 20 minutes

Year 5/6 up to 30 minutes

Work Health Safety

Student Ambulance Cover Conditions

Student Ambulance Cover applies to transportation following a student accident, not an illness or medical condition. School policy is to call an ambulance in the event of a serious injury or illness (eg severe asthma attack, anaphylactic reaction, seizure etc). If your child has a pre existing medical condition that falls into this category, please be aware that the cost of the ambulance may be at the parent's expense if you do not have family ambulance cover.

Driving safely near school buses

There is a 40km/h speed limit for traffic passing a school bus that is setting down or picking up school children. This speed limit is for all traffic travelling in the same direction as the bus, whether the bus is stationary or moving.

Lights will flash on the front and back of the bus reminding drivers that there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.

Buses can't stop quickly because they are large and heavy vehicles. So, remember:

Reduce speed to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing

Give way to buses

Watch out for children crossing

Never park in or near a bus stop or bus zone.

Informal school bus stops

Informal bus stops are not sign posted and are usually found in rural areas. They may be at the front of a property, or on the side of the road, which may make children difficult to see.




Safety Snapshot for Parents: Food Allergies

THE DANGER OF FOOD ALLERGIES

Allergies to foods or food ingredients are common, affecting around 5-6% of children up to 6 years of age, and 2% of children aged over 6. Some children's food allergies are so severe they can result in life-threatening anaphylactic shock. There are children in our school who have severe allergies.

When children are exposed to even a very small amount of a food they are allergic to (called an 'allergen'), by either ingesting, touching or inhaling it, their immune systems react. Cells under the lining of their skin, stomach, lungs, nose and eyes, which contain antibodies, detect the allergen and release their allergen-fighting bio-chemicals into the child's body tissues, triggering an allergic reaction. Anaphylaxis is the most severe and potentially life-threatening form of allergic reaction, almost always developing rapidly following exposure. It is a medical emergency, and requires immediate treatment by injecting the child with adrenaline.

The purpose of this Safety Snapshot is to ask you, and arm you, to work with us to protect the children in our school from allergic harm.

WHAT WE DO TO HELP PROTECT ALLERGIC CHILDREN

- ✓ We work with the parents of affected children to protect them from exposure to their allergens; and, in case they are exposed, to manage any resulting allergic or anaphylactic reaction
- ✓ We train all school personnel and students to know who the affected children are, how to protect them from exposure and what to do in case an allergic reaction occurs
- ✓ We consider food allergy risks, prevention and treatment measures in all our school, learning and community activity plans, including children's birthday and class celebrations.
- ✓ We ask parents of anaphylactic children to send a sealable box of allergy-safe cakes and/or food treats to be kept refrigerated or frozen at school so the child can join in classroom celebrations safely with their own food

WHAT WE ARE ASKING YOU TO DO TO HELP US PROTECT ALLERGIC CHILDREN

- ✓ (If your child is anaphylactic) Make sure you provide the school with all appropriate allergy management information and equipment for your child, including:
 - An up-to-date ASCIA Action Plan (signed by their GP)
 - An in-date auto-immune injector (ie. Anapen® or EpiPen®)
 - A labeled, sealable box of allergy-safe treats so your child can safely join class celebrations
- ✓ Talk to your child. Are there any children in his or her classes with allergies? How does the school, the teachers, and the other children help protect them from the thing(s) they are allergic to? How can your child help protect them (eg. by never sharing drinks, food, food containers or utensils)?
- ✓ Before you make any foods to send to school for sharing with other children, or for any other use at the school, contact the school to check if there is a list of ingredients that must not be used
- ✓ If you send any food to school for sharing, tape or secure a list of ingredients to the food container or plate so supervising school personnel can protect children at allergic risk
- ✗ Avoid using ingredients, or sending foods with ingredients, that are commonly allergenic. These 9 foods cause 90% of food allergies:

Peanuts | Tree nuts | Eggs (esp. uncooked) | Sesame | Soy | Fish | Shellfish | Wheat | Cow's milk
